

















Position of **UFPA** in the rankings




World University Rankings 2019

Internationalization is one of the best tools to guarantee a global scientific role, to form critical mass and to intervene with quality science, validated and certified by its peers, in the destinations and routes of global knowledge about the Amazon.



UFPA's INTERNATIONALIZATION

1957	UFPA Creation . Interinstitutional cooperation Program. Institutional agreements and individual initiatives by professors.
1986	Special Council of National and International Relations denominated ARNI Boosted programs of national and international cooperation
1987	Association of Amazonic Universities (UNAMAZ). Projects such as the System of Information of Amazon (SIAMAZ).
2008	ARNI prepared the infrastructure for program Erasmus Mundus, created by the section of Academic Mobility.
2009	ARNI became PROINTER (International Relations Office).
